KarunyaHacks Community members strives to:

Be friendly and welcoming. We strive to be a community that welcomes and supports people of various departments and years of study. All the students are welcomed to be a part of KarunyaHacks and it is not limited to any particular department or year.

Be respectful. Give respect and take respect, as KarunyaHacks is an open community consisting of students from various years of study. We expect students to be respectful towards each other and being a senior student doesn't give you any right to treat others bad. Not all of us will agree all the time, but disagreement is no excuse for poor behaviour and poor manners. We might all experience some frustration now and then, but we cannot allow that frustration to turn into a personal attack.

When in doubt ask for help. Nobody knows everything, and nobody is expected to be perfect in the KarunyaHacks community. Asking questions avoids many problems and confusions down the road which would eventually help in better productivity.

Be patient. This mostly applies to confirmation mails, phone calls and messages. KarunyaHacks is completely built on student volunteer's time both as participants and organizers. It is possible that your questions might not receive an immediate response. Be patient and consider the norms of the community.

We take the following very seriously, and any violations may impact your ability to participate in the KarunyaHacks community

- **Be careful with your words and actions.** We are a community of students, and we conduct ourselves professionally. Do not insult or put down other participants. Harassment and other exclusionary behaviour is not acceptable and should be reported. This includes but is not limited to:

- Violent threats or language directed against another person.
 - Discriminatory jokes and language.
 - Posting materials which degrades the community.
 - Personal insults, especially ragging.
 - Advocating for, or encouraging, any of the above behaviour.
